

# 1st Haircut “Dos”

- Try to schedule your appointment for a day and time that is good for your child when they won't be too tired, hungry or cranky. We have our online appointment schedule as well so you can see the times available that are convenient for your busy life. - First haircuts are often more stressful for the parents than the child. Try to relax! If you are nervous or overly emotional, your child will pick up on it right away. And don't worry about the crying or screaming, we are use to it, so if you're ok with it, we are ok with it! Bring snacks, a favorite toy, stuffed animal or blanket, something that is calming to them. I promise they will grow out of it eventually and end up loving to come get their haircut with their favorite stylist, play with toys and watch movies...
- If your child is having a hard time sitting in the styling car chair, we don't mind if they sit on your lap during the haircut, all of our stylists can cut their hair anywhere, I have even seen them cut hair in the middle of the salon because that's where this child wanted to be. Oh and don't forget an extra shirt, things can get a little messy.
- Since we are a kids salon, all of our stylist are trained to cut kids hair of all ethnics. I have stylist who have been working for Kids Hair Salon for over 24 years, now that's something I am extremely proud of!
- And for that "special" first haircut, you will receive a certificate with a lock of your child's hair attached, a picture, a framed magnet to put on your refrigerator, a sticker and of course we can't forget the lollipop, everyone gets a lollipop!
